Monday 30th

English: Reader: Competitions Around the World 2 pages

Skills book: P109 Before reading

Pick 3 new words (in black writing) from the story and put them in a sentence (use your english copy)

Gaeilge: read vocab on pg 124. This link can help with pronunciation. Just type in the word in the grey box <https://www.teanglann.ie/en/fuaim/buic%C3%A9ad>

Try put these into sentences(orally)

e.g. Tá Mamaí ag léamh.

Tá hata buí ar an tuáille

Close the book and see how many words you can remember.

Maths: Mental Maths: Monday

Tables: Subtract 8

Plant Maths: pg 130 this is showing the relationship between addition and subtraction e.g. $10+4=14$ so $14-4=10$

You might like to talk through this with your child and use objects (toys, blocks) to show them the links. The blue boxes in B and C should help.

Religion: Discuss your favourite bible stories.

Tuesday:

English: Reader next 2 pages

English grammar next day

Discuss procedures (remember it has to be very clear and in the correct order) e.g. How to make a smoothie, How to tie your shoelace, How to make a sandwich. You may like to try making it. Write out your steps and follow them to see if you left anything out!

Gaeilge: Read words on pg 125 and try put them into sentences (orally)

Write out the words on a sheet, cut them into small squares and play Cluiche Kim 'Cad a thóg mé'

Maths: Mental maths: Tuesday

Tables: Subtract 8

Planet maths: pg 131 the children should be able to do this independently; some may need the question read to them. Use the number line to help.

Explorers: pg 58 read The Tale of Lutey and the Mermaid and complete a comic strip of the main parts of the story.

You can act out the story with your siblings/people in your house and show your parents if you like!!

Wednesday:

English : Reader next 2 pages

Skills Book: pg 110 During reading

Gaeilge: Read the rólímirt on pg 126, underline any words you find difficult.

Ar chaill tu = did you lose? Practising using this phrase

e.g. ar chaill tu t-léine? Ar chaill tu spád?

The answers are - Chaill mé, (I lost) Níor chaill mé (I didn't lose)

Pg 127 match the words to the pictures

Maths: Mental Maths Wednesday

Tables subtract 8

Planet maths: pg 132 subtraction

Subtracting using an abacus is new to the kids so parents might like to read the blue box on pg 132 and explain it to the children. Remember to always do the units first. Section C on this page should be more familiar to the children again starting with units first subtract the bottom number from the top number.

Explorers: Discuss sequence of the story on pg 58. In your SESE copy: 'Imagine you were granted three wishes. Draw a picture and write a sentence about each one'

Thursday

English: Reader next 2 pages

Just Phonics: pg 54 ow sound match word to picture. Remember ow can make two sounds owl (ow sound) snow (oh sound)

Pg 57 read words and match to pictures.

These can be done orally or print and fill in.

Gaeilge: read rólímirt pg 126

Complete the end section of pg 127 the first box is ar chaill tu caipín. Can you figure out the rest?

Draw a picture in your copy of you and your family at the beach, how many things can you label as gaeilge?

Maths: Mental Maths-Thursday

Tables subtract 8

Planet Maths: pg 143, revise subtracting big numbers. Parents could write out sums for children to complete. Try a mixture of 2 digit and 1 digit sums e.g 58-26 and 35- 4. Remember always do the units first.

Explorers: Discuss the importance of rainfall. Read pg 61 floods and droughts. Complete a Venn diagram to compare floods and droughts (the things they have in common go in the middle)

Friday

English: Reader last 2 pages

Skills book: Write a procedure- How to make a gold medal. Use picture prompts on page 115 to help. Remember to write full sentences, each sentence should start with a bossy verb (tells you what to do e.g. use, cut, draw). When finished please look back over your sentences making sure you have capital letters at the beginning of each sentence and full stops at the end, also check spelling.

Gaeilge: Read rólimirt

Pg 129 insert ea into each word, can you read them and find the words in the word search? ea makes an 'a' sound.

Play cluiche kim(from Monday) or choose 6 words from pages 124,125 and play bingo with another family member.

Maths: Mental Maths- Friday review and problem solving

Tables subtract 8
