Play this game with a sibling/family member. If you do not have dice at home the second link is to dice online, click on the dice and it will roll to a new number.


You can make up your own rules/ add to these rules to make it easier/harder.

Have you got maths eyes? Put your maths eyes on and look around your environment, can you see anything that can be linked to maths? It may be patterns, shapes, counting or adding, seeing a line of symmetry. Take a picture of it and write 3 questions. See example below.



for example with this picture I could ask what pattern do you see?, what shape does each colour make?, what shape do the yellow and blue colours make together? Can you continue the pattern?

**Work It Out Wednesday-** See the STEM card attached. Challenge yourself to make a paper aeroplane. You can design the aeroplane any way you like, be as creative as you can. See if you can make the aeroplane without looking on youtube/google for help 😊

What do you think will be most important to keep in mind when making the aeroplane, so it will cut through the air and travel the required 2metres?
