A: There are 2 T's in THAT!


Q: What goes up, but never comes down?

-Planet Maths: 3-D shapes. A 3-D shape is a solid object that has 3 dimensions: length, width and height.




The Vertex on a 3-D shape is the corner. Plural=vertices.


The Edge is the line along the shape.

The face is the flat surface.

3-D shape names:




A prism may be sliced in such a way that all of the slices are the same size.



When a **pyramid** is cut into slices, the slices **are not** all the same size.

To name a pyramid you look at its base. The following pyramids are the names of the pyramids below: Square pyramid, hexagonal pyramid, pentagonal pyramid and triangular pyramid.
